Dear Board of Commissioners:

The Department of the Interior (Department) gives notice that the group known as the Grand River Bands of Ottawa Indians (GRB), a petitioner for Federal acknowledgment as an Indian tribe, has chosen to complete the petitioning process under the current version of the acknowledgment regulations, located at Part 83 of Title 25 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (25 C.F.R. Part 83). GRB had been proceeding under the previous version of the regulations (as they existed prior to July 31, 2015). The GRB's petition number remains #146.

On May 6, 2025, the Department published notice of GRB's choice to proceed under the current regulations in the *Federal Register* (90 Fed. Reg. 19,227). The Department has also published certain information regarding GRB's documented petition, including the petition narrative, on the Office of Federal Acknowledgment's (OFA) website (<https://www.bia.gov/as-ia/ofa>). The OFA will advise you when it begins review of the petition under the current regulations.
